The old fashioned wooden toys were also popular, as many children discovered that you could have fun with something that didn't have batteries or push buttons. A Maypole was constructed and the traditional dance was demonstrated by the museum staff and volunteers. A petting zoo with a sheep shearing demonstration was also interesting as the demonstrators showed how even the raw wool could be made into yarn by twisting it by hand.

The museum staff and volunteers will be working towards more events for the coming season depicting an agricultural theme.

The railway exhibit is nearing completion and should be one of the premier exhibits in the Community Museum. As noted in previous reports the railway was a major determining factor in the history and development of our town. It will be worth viewing.
