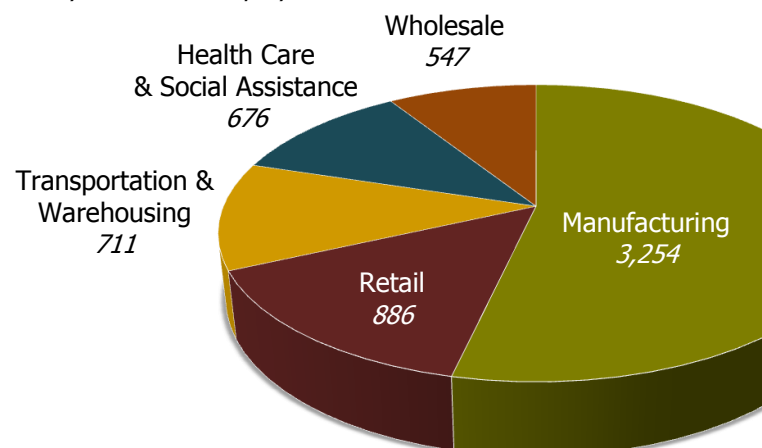

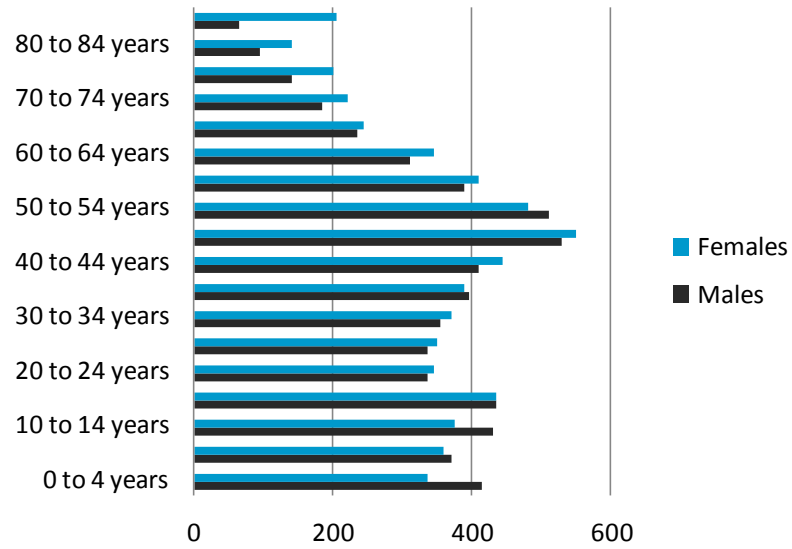
Employment Overview
