



GARBAGE AND RECYCLING PICK-UP IS CHANGING

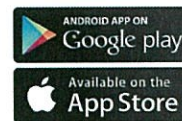
Beginning September 14, 2015

Starting Monday, September 14, a new curbside collection program for garbage and recycling starts in Blandford-Blenheim, East Zorra-Tavistock, Ingersoll, Norwich, South-West Oxford, Tillsonburg and Zorra. **Households in these communities have a new garbage and recycling pick-up day.**

Wasteline.ca also provides info on the County bag tag program, collection guidelines and what materials can be recycled.

WHAT'S CHANGING?

1. Collection days and times. Check calendar or Wasteline.ca.
2. Recycling can now go into the same blue box. No more sorting.
3. Recycling and garbage will be picked up in one truck with two compartments.
4. Garbage and recycling will now be picked up on statutory holidays except Christmas Day and New Year's Day (with the exception of South-West Oxford and Woodstock, see your calendar for details).
5. New web tools to take the guess work out of curbside collection.

That means all your recycling can go in one blue box!



NEW! Spiral wound containers – chip containers, frozen concentrate juice



NEW! Empty aerosol containers



NEW! Coffee cups and lids



NEW! Thermoform plastic and polystyrene meat trays, takeout containers, styrofoam egg cartons. No bulky styrofoam



Steel & Aluminum food & beverage cans



Aluminum foil, clean no food residue



Mixed paper, envelopes, and flyers



Mixed plastics, tubs & lids



Newspapers, Magazines, & Telephone books



Plastic containers



Empty paint cans, lid off



Boxboard



Glass jars and bottles



Milk cartons & juice boxes



Cardboard must be flattened and tied in bundles no larger than 76cm x 76cm x 20cm (30" x 30" x 8"), max weight of 9kg (20lbs)/ bundle. No waxed cardboard.

NEW! Plastic bags and most other film plastics are now accepted in the blue box. Here's how to prepare them.

STUFF ALL PLASTIC BAGS AND FILM IN ONE BAG

TIE



TIE YOUR FULL BAG CLOSED

TOSS



TOSS YOUR BAG INTO YOUR BLUE BOX
