**1. 2013 January Additional Work Projects:**

- Financial Analysis – Facility/Program Recovery Rates;
- Sports Hall of Fame – Fund Raising Strategy – Goal – \$75,000;
- Assisting Community Dog Park Committee.

**2. Ingersoll Cheese and Agricultural Museum Highlights**

- The Museum is now selling Quality Sheep Milk Products from Salford, in addition to Gunn’s Hill Artisan Cheese;
- The Museum installed a display entitled “Presents from the Past” at St. Jude’s School for the school display case prior to Christmas;
- The Museum is now part of the new Oxford Cheese Trail, an initiative organized by Oxford Tourism;
- The Curator will be installing a 6 month exhibit on the history of Ingersoll and its connection with the cheese industry at Queen’s Park on January 23<sup>rd</sup>;

- The New Year begins with an new exhibition: “Very Superstitious” opens on January 13<sup>th</sup>, and will run until June 13<sup>th</sup>. Everyone is invited to visit the display, if you are not scared!
- Attendance for 2012: Year to Date total: 5,333; 2011 year to date total: 5,118
  - December attendance 2012: 782; 2011 December attendance: 669

### 3. **Fusion Highlights:**

- On Wednesday, December 12, 2012 Fusion hosted the 5<sup>th</sup> Annual Youth Awards & Christmas Dinner. A total of 72 youth attended the dinner and awards ceremony. Nineteen youth received an award and over a dozen parents attended the ceremony;
  - Fusion youth and staff participated in the Operation Christmas Child Initiative that is organized through several Ingersoll churches. With the help of staff and youth, we filled a total of 25 Shoe Boxes;
  - The 2013 United Way application was submitted for funding. The member agency panel review is on January 24, 2013;
  - In December Fusion staff and youth produced a special Christmas episode of Fusion TV, with greetings from the Mayor, CAO, as well as local politicians and community leaders.
4. On Monday, January 31, 2012 PlayRight Ingersoll planned and coordinated the 1<sup>st</sup> Annual Family New Year’s Eve Funomenon event at the Arena from 6 pm to 9 pm. The event as a resounding success with over 700 people attending. The evening included free skating, games, crafts, bouncy castle and 2,000 balloons were dropped from the arena ceiling at 9 pm.
- Coordinated by Cathy Cripps and Teresa Cameron and with the help of 25 volunteers the evening raised over \$2,000 towards upgrading the Town’s playground equipment. Sponsorships for the event included: LPL Plumbing, Funnell Insurance Group, CAW Local 88, BrokerLink, Ingersoll Oxford Reality, Ingersoll Kiwanis Club, Warren Sinclair Homes, Hurley’s Independent, Kraft Korner, Tim Horton’s and Butterworths Skate Sharpening.
- Special thanks is extended to Parks and Recreation staff Nancy Nadalin, Recreation Program Staff, Allen Bragg, Tom Mabee and especially Dan St Amand for his collaboration, enthusiasm and assistance.
5. On August 24, 2012 with Council approval the Town of Ingersoll applied for Community Infrastructure Improvement Funding (CIIF) for improvements at the Ingersoll District Memorial Centre – Arena/Auditorium. The improvements included: Replacement of Arena Sprinkler System, Upgrading Arena & Auditorium Lights, Replacing Arena Roof Membrane and accessibility upgrades. In late December the Town received notification that the application for Infrastructure Funding had not been approved.
