

Have your say on the County Council composition review

Visit *Speak Up, Oxford!* to send a comment or fill out the 7-question survey

Residents of Oxford County are being asked to give their feedback on a Council composition review that will look at the number of members on Council, the election of the County Warden, and how voting is carried out during Council meetings.

To have a say on the Council composition review, residents can visit www.oxfordcounty.ca/speakup to fill out a short, 7-question survey or submit a comment. Feedback can also be sent directly to the County Clerk at clerksoffice@oxfordcounty.ca.

Speak Up, Oxford! includes more information on the review, including a timeline and the [June 10 Council report](#) with full details. **An online public meeting on the Council composition review will take place on Wednesday, July 8 at 9:30 a.m.**

Public feedback will be used to prepare a report and recommendations to County Council, and will also be shared with area municipal councils as they prepare their additional feedback. The final Oxford County Council report will be submitted to the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing.

Oxford County is required by legislation to review its council composition and reach decisions by December 1, 2020. Any changes would take effect at the beginning of the 2023-2027 Council term.
