Special Staff Reports

Plant More Trees

In alignment with the goals of the Strategic Plan, Council approved the adoption of the 'Plant More Trees' Policy which establishes that the Town will plant an additional 3,805 tress by 2030. In order to achieve this objective, the Town will continue to provide new trees to residents free of cost, require developers to plant three trees for every one that is cut down and will endeavour to plant 80 trees annually in the Town's public spaces.

2023 Budget Approval

After deferring their decision in February, Council approved the 2023 Budget. The Budget represents an effective rate increase of 1.8%, the lowest of all Oxford County municipalities, includes no new debt and a cost of living increase for staff of 3.5%.

ZN 6-22-08, Supplemetary Report and Decision
