Al was born in Ingersoll, Ontario, where he played many sports during his youth. In 1963, Al was a member of the Ingersoll Midget "B" Ontario Baseball Championship team after being called up from the Bantams in the play-offs. During high school, Al became a running back for the I.D.C.I. football team and won the Oxford-Elgin Senior Collegiate Championship in 1968.

Along with his involvement on the football team, Al also played wing for The Ingersoll Marlands Junior Hockey Team from 1968 to 1969, winning the Inter-County League scoring title during his time there.

Al went on to The University of Western Ontario, where he played with the Mustangs. In 1972—his fourth year playing with the team—Al helped them to the Canadian Inter-Collegiate senior Football Championship, defeating the Alberta University Golden Bears to win The Vanier Cup.
