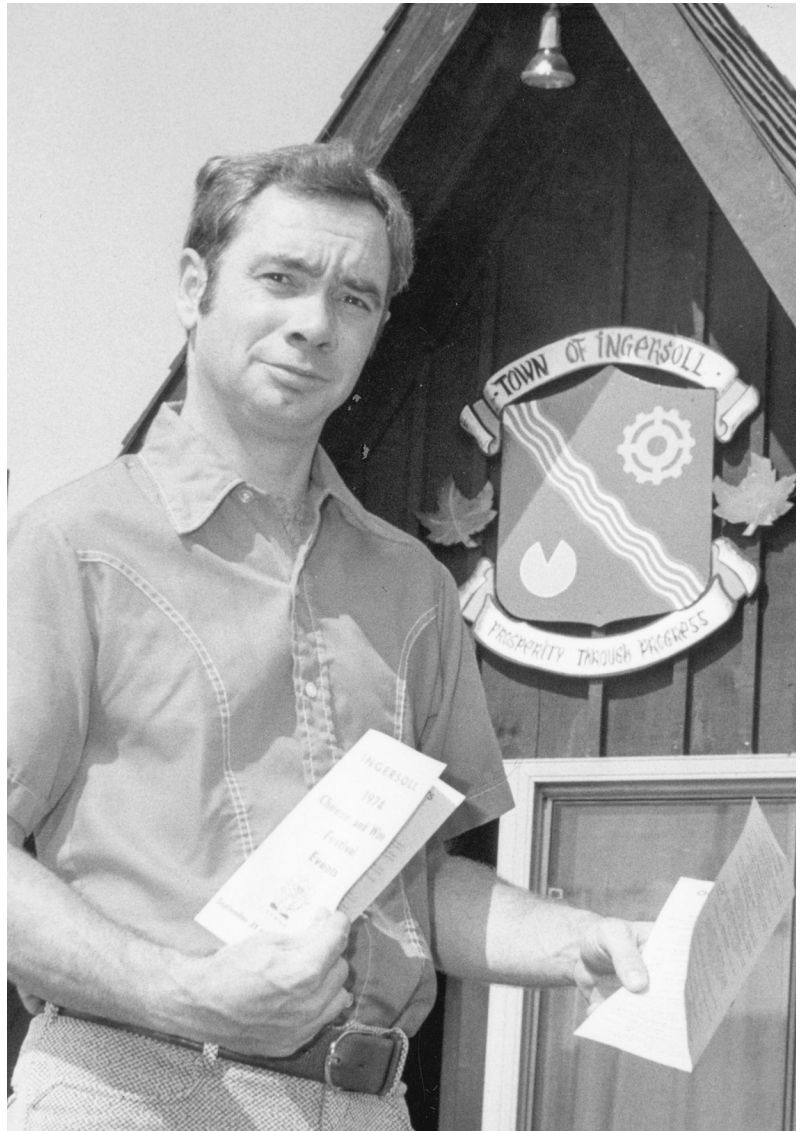


Doug Harris

Doug and his wife Glenna moved to Ingersoll in 1966, where he continued his teaching career at I.D.C.I., and his love for sports was quickly revealed. Doug has coached several sports at I.D.C.I. as well as coaching house league hockey, baseball, and fastball within the community. Doug also organized a Junior Fastball Team in 1969 that went on to become the Ontario Champions of their division in 1974 and 1975.

Doug has been an executive member of various ball leagues, one of the original organizers of the first four teams to play slowpitch in Ingersoll, a key player in the startup of House League Fastball and Minor Basketball, and the organizer of a co-ed slow pitch league. Doug, along with co-chairs Don Reid and Judy Hayes, organized the first CAN AM Games in Alma, Michigan. Additionally, Doug played an instrumental role in the formation of the Sports Hall of Fame in 1986.
