As an athlete who excelled in many areas, Jack successfully played hockey, baseball, and fastball for Ingersoll and the surrounding area for over thirty years.

Jack played hockey for the Ingersoll Junior "C" Lions and in the senior division for the Hellcats. In 1947, Jack represented Ingersoll at a Provincial East-West All-Star Game played at Maple Leaf Gardens in Toronto.

In the summertime, Jack enjoyed playing baseball and fastball. The heavy hitting outfielder played juvenile, junior, and intermediate baseball for Ingersoll and Woodstock teams, nearly making it to the big leagues after being signed by Bradford, Pennsylvania of the P.O.N.Y. League in 1948. Jack played many positions, but was best noted for his pitching and outfield play.
