Position Overview

As a Museum Visitor Experience Assistant, you will play a key role in enhancing the experience of museum visitors. Your primary responsibilities will include supporting tours, outreach programs, school programs, and general visitor services. You will also assist the Museum Manager and staff in researching, planning, and setting up exhibitions. This include staffing the front desk, answering and directing phone calls, processing gift shop sales, assisting with camping, and managing and fulfilling research requests.

In addition, you will assist the Collections Coordinator as needed with organizing and caring for the museum and collection of artifacts, photographs, and documents. You will gain experience using the museum & collection management software, PastPerfect, to input and cross-reference data and assist with research requests to locate and provide information about items in the collection.

This position is expected to begin at the beginning of May 4, 2026, to August 28, 2026, for 35 hours per week
