At the Canadian Harvard Aircraft Association (CHAA) in Tillsonburg, the flying season may be in full swing, but the work of preserving Canada's iconic Second World War yellow trainers never slows down. Behind every historic aircraft is a dedicated team of volunteers who spend countless hours maintaining, restoring, and flying these warbirds as a reminder & remembrance to our past. The Harvard is a living artifact of the Royal Canadian Air Force and the British Commonwealth Air Training Plan - one of the most significant aviation training programs in history. Keeping these aircraft flying allows guests to experience the sound, power, and presence that thousands of wartime pilots once knew. CHAA's monthly Open House & Fly Days will continue on June 27 (Rain date: June 28) at the Tillsonburg Regional Airport, offering visitors a rare chance to get up close to the aircraft, explore the hangars & learn how the Harvard Aircraft Association keeps history in the air. AGRICULTURAL AWARDS ANNOUNCED

The Oxford County Federation of Agriculture (OCFA) is proud to announce that George Gilvesy has been named the 2025 Agricultural Hall of Fame recipient. Gilvesy was officially inducted into the Hall of Fame at the Oxford County Council meeting Apr 22, where his photograph will be displayed in the Oxford County Council building to honour his outstanding contributions to local & national agriculture. In addition, at its Annual General Meeting this past January, the OCFA presented the Family Farm Award to the Doan Family, celebrating their longstanding commitment to farming excellence & community service. The Family Farm Award recognizes an intergenerational farming operation that demonstrates progressive achievements & a deep commitment to community service. The Doan Family, farming in the Norwich area since 1919, perfectly embodies these values. Now operating across multiple farms, the family manages diverse agricultural enterprises including dairy, turkey broiler, beef & extensive cash crop operations. The Doan family is celebrated for their ability to blend deep-rooted tradition with modern innovation, continuously pushing the boundaries of efficiency while remaining heavily involved in local 4-H programs & community sports. The Agricultural Hall of Fame Award honours an individual who demonstrates outstanding leadership and an unwavering dedication to strengthening the rural community & the broader agricultural industry. This year's recipient, George Gilvesy, has spent over 46 years elevating Canadian agriculture on the global stage. Beginning his career as a tobacco grower in Tillsonburg, Gilvesy transitioned to powerful advocacy roles, eventually leading the Ontario Greenhouse Vegetable Growers through a period of unprecedented growth. His tireless work in international trade, labour reform & climate policy has safeguarded the livelihoods of countless farmers across the nation. In recognition of his lifetime of service, his photograph will be permanently displayed in the hall of the Oxford County Council building alongside previous Agricultural Hall of Fame distinguished winners. The OCFA congratulates the Doan Family and George Gilvesy for their remarkable contributions to the agricultural sector. Their hard work ensures that the local farming industry remains vibrant, resilient, and forward-looking for generations to come. 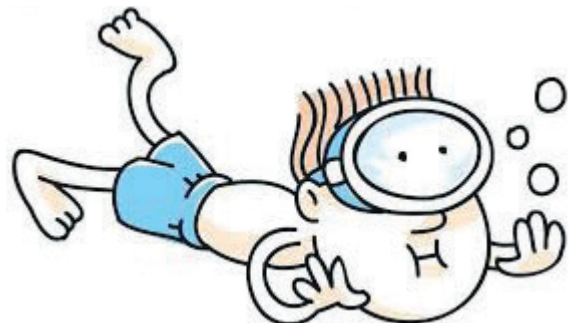
SWIMMING LESSONS MATTER

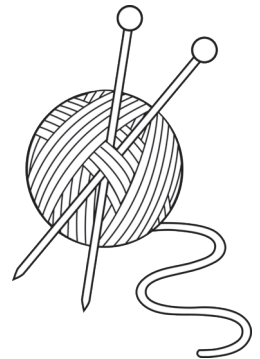

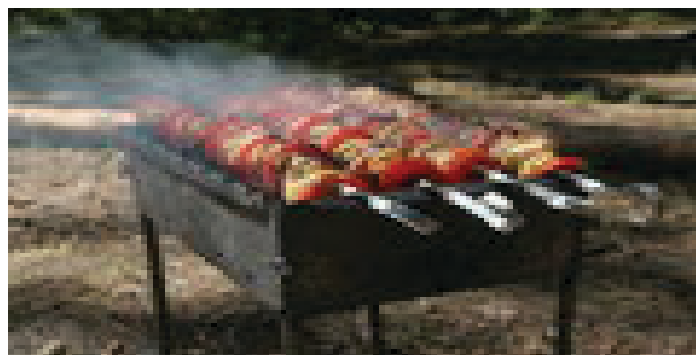
