Town of Ingersoll Presents Strategic Priorities at 2026 ROMA Conference

INGERSOLL, ON (January 19, 2026) — Town leaders met with provincial officials at the 2026 ROMA [Rural Ontario Municipal Association] Conference in Toronto this week. The goal was to discuss Ingersoll’s future and secure support for local projects.

Key Meetings and Goals:

- **Minister of Economic Development, Job Creation and Trade**
 - The Town met with the Minister to discuss the GM CAMI Assembly plant.
 - The Town asked for help to build new roads and utilities to support job creation and housing growth, keeping economic stability.
- **Minister of Sport**
 - Leaders asked the Minister of Sport for funding to help build the Multi-Use Recreation Centre (MURC).
 - This building will be the heart of a new area that includes housing, a school, and a long-term care home.
- **Parliamentary Assistant to the Minister of Finance**
 - The Town spoke with the Ministry of Finance about local tax challenges.
 - Ingersoll leaders asked the province to update how auto plants are valued for taxes.
 - The Town requested fair shares of provincial grants, such as *Ontario Municipal Partnership Fund (OMPF)* and *Ontario Community Infrastructure Fund (OCIF)*, to keep the Town’s finances stable.
